INTRODUCTION

This study of printing in Maryland from 1843 through 1846 is part of a research project sponsored by the American Imprints Inventory which has as its goal the preparation of a complete national bibliography. It is imperative that those records of the civilization and culture of early America which are extant be preserved for and be made accessible to historians and other scholars. During the last decade, microfilm has gained wide acceptance as a means of bringing the contents of rare and valuable written materials into the possession of scholars throughout the world. Librarians realize that it is not always possible for scholars in distant places to learn of the existence of these publications. Therefore, the American Imprints Inventory was established. It is my purpose, in this particular work, to present a complete record of all printing in Maryland from 1843 through 1846. Success in such an undertaking is virtually impossible, yet even a partial list is valuable to scholars as a tool for the location of surviving copies. I have included in this check-list all items printed in Maryland whose existence can be verified. Each entry is concluded with a list of libraries which report having the item. References are made to the major bibliographies in which any item is listed.

Even a cursory study of the list will show us that many of the problems that confronted Marylanders were national and even universal in scope and interest. We find copies of these works located in such distant regions as California, Texas, Florida, Canada, and the British Isles. By including these distant locations, we assist scholars in finding the copy which is closest to them.

Without the aid furnished by the American Imprints Inventory, it would be a hopeless undertaking for any individual to try to locate all the extant

copies of a printed item over one hundred years old. The bulk of the information about these items was first gathered by the WPA Writers' Project. The slips prepared by that project are stored under the protection of the National Union Catalog at the Library of Congress, but have been sorted only as to state and year. Obviously, it would be too time-consuming for a scholar to search through thousands of slips many of which were incomplete or incorrect. My task, then, was to put these slips in order and to copy them, making only one master card wherever duplicate slips existed. The next step was to check the cards against the National Union Catalog, making whatever corrections were signified. Items not located in the National Union Catalog were verified either by visits to neighboring libraries or by letters to the more distant libraries. Whenever possible, I have actually examined a copy of the item; but because of the wide dissemination of the titles in this check-list, many of them were inaccessible.

The wide variety of subjects covered by Maryland printing during this period can best be explained by a brief mention of the national and regional background of the period. In the following chapters an attempt will be made to provide background on three subjects--the nation, the state, and the printers.

Before proceeding with the history, however, I must acknowledge my gratitude to the staff of the National Union Catalog of the Library of Congress and to the staffs of the Diocesan Library in Baltimore, the Enoch Pratt Free Library, the Maryland Historical Society, and the library of the Peabody Institute. With their cooperation and advice, a difficult job was made pleasant.

CHAPTER I

THE UNITED STATES IN THE 1840's

THE UNITED STATES IN THE 1840's

The United States was a young and growing nation in 1843. The events of the 1840's mark a turning point in American policies and politics. In fact, one writer has labeled 1846 "The year of Decision."¹ Let us consider briefly the national scene from 1843 through 1846.

On January 1, 1843, John Tyler was President of the United States. He had advanced to that office on April 4, 1841, upon the death of President William Henry Harrison. Tyler's views clashed sharply with those of Henry Clay, and this split within the Whig party caused a stalemate on domestic questions. Nevertheless, there were two noteworthy achievements during his term. First, Tyler supported the Webster-Ashburton Treaty with Great Britain, and then he succeeded in bringing about the annexation of Texas through a joint congressional resolution.

Tyler was followed in office by James Knox Polk, one of the least appreciated of American presidents. The Democratic National Convention in Baltimore was expected to nominate Martin Van Buren for President with Polk as his running mate, but Van Buren's stand on Texas so irritated the South that it became evident that he would not have Southern support. To preserve harmony within the party, Polk was given the nomination. Perhaps because he was expected to be a party tool, his achievements were not given due recognition in his own day, but his record speaks for itself.

From the day that he entered office, Polk proceeded steadily and relentlessly toward his four major goals--reduction of the tariff of 1842, re-establishment of the independent treasury, settlement of the Oregon controversy, and acquisition of California. He also reaffirmed and enlarged the Monroe Doctrine excluding all non-American intervention in American affairs. Finally, he maneuvered Mexico into a war which he waged to a successful conclusion.

Personally lacking in color, this serious, hard-working executive knew what he wanted done and he knew how to get it done. Few presidents have so thoroughly controlled their administration, or have so effectively set the course for future administrations.

Among the members of Polk's cabinet were James Buchanan as Secretary of State and George Bancroft as Secretary of the Navy. Buchanan, who was later to become President himself, was responsible for one of the most important items of political controversy issued in Maryland during this period. His Last Letter to Mr. Pakenham on the American Title to Oregon will be found in this check-list under United States "Dept. of State."

Bancroft is important in another way. As a result of his efforts, a Naval School was started at Fort Severn in Annapolis. It was officially opened on October 10, 1845, and in 1850 it was renamed the United States Naval Academy. In 1851, a regular four-year course was adopted.

In 1844, the first public telegraph message was sent from the United States Capitol to the Mount Clare Station in Baltimore. America's first railway station was later in that same year the point of origin for the first political dispatch--the proceedings of the Democratic National Convention which nominated Polk.

The fledgling Baltimore Sun was the first newspaper to use the telegraph, and its system was so efficient that government officials read news of the Mexican War in the Sun as much as twenty-four hours before they obtained the same news through government channels.²

The United States in the 1840's was the stage for such varied performers as the Mormons fleeing from persecutions in Illinois and Missouri to their own haven in the vast no-man's-land surrounding the Great Salt Lake and the Brook Farmers' fleeing from reality to their Utopia at West Roxbury, Massachusetts. This was the era of Henry Thoreau, who found contentment in solitude, and of Francis Parkman, who spent his time among the Indians. It was a time when

military men caught the public fancy. General Zachary Taylor's victory in Mexico led straight to the White House, and he and his officers were celebrated in numberless ballads and marches. The adventurous and strongly nationalistic spirit of these years is mirrored in the publications of the period. America was becoming aware of the rest of the continent and of the rest of the world.

CHAPTER II

MARYLAND IN THE 1840'S

MARYLAND IN THE 1840's

Although the nation was young in 1843, some of the individual states were already vigorous and powerful. One of the most distinctive states was then and is now Maryland. From its very foundation over two hundred years previously, Maryland had been a proud and independent territory.

In 1649, a noble act of religious toleration was passed by the assembly of Maryland, which threw the mantle of Charity over all, and in the benefits of which the Quaker, Catholic and Puritan participated. . . . By this act, all sects and denominations of Christians were secured in the profession of their faith, and in the exercise of their religion according to the dictates of their consciences; and it was made an offense, punishable by a fine of ten shillings, to stigmatize any inhabitant of the colony as a heretic or a schismatic, or by any similar epithet, on account of his religious belief.¹

Its location made Maryland a natural buffer state sharing both the industrial and commercial interests of the North and the agrarian interests of the South. Nevertheless, it was one of the most ambitious and aggressive states in the union. The internal improvements program of the state was indicative of the spirit of its people. A contemporary outline of the program, published in 1845, tells us:

The Chesapeake and Ohio Canal is 184 miles long, cost the sum of \$12,370,470 and has even in its present unfinished state an average income of some 50 or \$60,000.

The Tide Water Canal is 45 miles long and cost \$2,900,000.

The Port Deposit Canal is 10 miles long and cost \$200,000.

The Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road [sic] is 188 miles long and cost some 6 or \$7,000,000. Its income in 1844 was \$658,620, and its nett [sic] profit \$346,946.

The Baltimore and Washington Rail Road is 38 miles long and cost 3,000,000. [sic] and its income was \$212,129. of which \$101,529. was nett. [sic]

The Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road is 58 miles long and cost \$7,623,000.

The Annapolis and Elk Ridge Railroad is 20½ miles in length and cost \$414,435,60. [sic]

These figures show an investment of at least \$32,000,000 in internal improvements, or, on the basis of an approximate population of 500,000 people in 1850, an average expenditure of \$64 per person. This is truly an amazing display of civic enterprise.

Maryland during this period had entered into a plan to emigrate all Negroes in the state to "Maryland in Liberia." The Maryland State Colonization Society was formed for this purpose, and it offered free passage to Africa to any Negro who wished to settle. The Society was partially supported by state funds.³ At the same time, the state was trying to attract immigrants from Europe. Due to famines and persecutions in the Old World, the immigration plan was far more successful than the emigration scheme. The United States Census for 1850 reported that 12.85 per cent (or 53,750) of the white population of Maryland was foreign born.⁴

The Maryland Historical Society was founded in 1844, and its activities were responsible for many important works issued during the period (and since). In 1845, John Pendleton Kennedy delivered an address on Lord Calvert before the Society. This discourse set off one of the most violent literary disputes of the decade. His talk was published, and a review of it appeared in the United States Catholic Magazine. In a subsequent issue he replied to the reviewer, but the controversy raged for months.

Francis Thomas was the governor of Maryland from 1841 until 1844, when he was succeeded by Thomas G. Pratt. During his term the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad was completed to Cumberland. Pratt's term saw the inauguration of telegraph service, the establishment of the United States Naval Academy, and the Mexican War.

Maryland has an honorable heritage of religious freedom, and we find many religious "firsts" connected with Baltimore. In 1787, the Methodist Church had established the first Sunday School. Four years later, the first Catholic theological seminary in the United States was opened. Baltimore is the primatial see in the United States, and its Cathedral, begun in 1806, was the first one in the country. The city was the scene of several church councils, both provincial and plenary. Naturally, it became a center of Catholic publishing. The Publication Rooms of the Evangelical Lutheran Church were also

located in Baltimore, and the constant flow of controversial tracts makes up a large part of the total output of Maryland presses.

The state was proud of its literacy rate, and one report to the General Assembly included the following figures:

By the census of 1840.

Universities or colleges 12, Pupils in same 813.

Academies and grammar schools 127, Pupils in same 4178.

Primary and common schools 567, Number of scholars in same 16,982.

Number of persons over 20 who cannot read 11,605.⁵

The increase in total population during these years, together with the rise in literacy, created an audience large enough to support several newspapers, and the division of opinion on both internal improvements and external policies provided editors with the opportunity to build circulation by espousing one of the factions in any major dispute.

An educated populace demanded more than legal documents and hymn books. That is why, by the middle years of the 1840's, Maryland printers were issuing such items as political addresses, agricultural pamphlets, almanacs, biographies, histories, letters, music, philosophy, poetry, drama, science, sermons, organizational material, and textbooks.

CHAPTER III

THE PRINTERS OF MARYLAND DURING THE 1840's

THE PRINTERS OF MARYLAND DURING THE 1840's

Printers are known to have operated in Maryland as early as 1658, and by 1843 Baltimore was one of the most important printing centers in the country. We are told that:

There has never been in the courts of Maryland any legally appointed or established Reporter, but the reports of the arguments of the cases, and the judgments of the court have been made by private persons whose undertakings the State encourages by subscribing for a number of copies, so as to remunerate them for their expense and trouble. The first Reports in Maryland were of the cases in the General Court of the State, the old Court of Appeals &c. and extended from the year 1658 to the Revolution. They were then continued by Harris and Johnson, from 1800 to 1826, after which they were continued by Harris and Gill, and subsequently by Gill and Johnson.¹

The census of 1850 reports 17 "printers and publishers" with a total staff of 229 printing employees in the city of Baltimore.² The whole state had only 28 "printers and publishers" employing 272 printing operatives.³ An interesting discussion of these figures appeared in 1856.

Of the 28 printers returned in the census, 2 are reported from Anne Arundel County, 17 for the city of Baltimore, and 9 for Washington County. Thus it would appear that 18 counties have no printers within their limits; yet in the returns of the newspaper press, (published under the Census Commissioner's name in Livingston's Law Register for 1852,) it is shown that in the counties that are apparently without printers and publishers, there are no less than 32 newspapers issued from no less than 24 several towns and villages. There must be some omission here, else the printers of Maryland must be veritable descendants of Dr. Faustus, and print by magic or some other spiritual agency, which the census takers could not assess. The amount of capital invested therein, the raw material consumed, or the annual product thereof, are under the circumstances, no doubt, purposely omitted, although an exposition on these points would have been very interesting.⁴

Among the printers in Maryland during this period, none was more important than John Murphy. He had been born in Ireland and he came to this country with his parents before his eleventh birthday. A few years later he was apprenticed to a Philadelphia printer. About 1835, he moved to Baltimore and set up a printing and stationery house and, within a few years, branched out into the publication of books.

As a publishing house of high standards and laudable ideals, Murphy and Company did a substantial general business, although its specialty was Catholic books. Catholic writers, some of whom became prelates, owed Murphy a debt of gratitude, for he courageously undertook ponderous theological works for which there was a restricted market, and assumed losses which were met by the profits from commercial printing and the sale of textbooks.⁵

Other outstanding printers were Joseph Robinson, who specialized in Masonic reports and anti-Catholic tracts; Fielding Lucas, Jr., whose work seems to be the closest approach to fine printing produced in Maryland during the period; Johann Gruber, whose press at Hagerstown was the center of German printing in Maryland; William McNeir and the firm of Riley and Davis, both of Annapolis, and both specializing in the printing of official government documents.

Music was printed in Baltimore so early as 1792, and by 1800 there were at least four men who printed music exclusively.⁶ During the 1840's there were several music printers, but the three most important firms were those run by Frederick D. Benteen, George Willig, Jr., and W. C. Peters. Both the Maryland Historical Society and the University of Virginia possess large collections of early Maryland imprints in the field of music.

Taylor, Wilde & Co., which was affiliated with William Taylor in New York, published several volumes of plays and at least one series of dramatic works--the Modern Standard Dramas, edited by Epes Sargent.

Finally, the publication of organizational material--minutes, by-laws, resolutions, etc.--provided a lucrative field in which most of the Maryland printers had some share.

CONCLUSION

CONCLUSION

The terminal date of 1846 is, of course, an arbitrary one, employed only for the purposes of this check-list. Most of the publishers active during this period had entered the trade many years before, and most of them were to continue in business beyond 1846. There is no reason to believe that January 1, 1847, marked the beginning of a new era in their lives; but since we must base our conclusion solely on the period covered by the check-list, we have tried to recreate the events which occurred before that date that had some influence on printing in Maryland.

The check-list itself is the true history of printing during the period. Only from it can we get the exact figures and percentages concerning the type and number of items printed during these four years. The appended charts, on the annual output of printers by cities and towns and on the types of works printed in Maryland, serve to uncover some of the material that is buried in this check-list. The maps are intended to show the locations of the firms printing during this period.

These materials, which have been preserved for us by the activity of library systems throughout the Western world, are here gathered together for the benefit of researchers. The entries are as complete and accurate as human frailty permits.

In summation, we can see that the items issued by the printers in Maryland during this period are a reliable index to the events and topics of the times. On the national scene, the big issues were Westward expansion and the question of slavery. Locally, internal improvements and religious controversies provided subject matter for many publications.

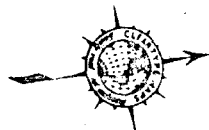
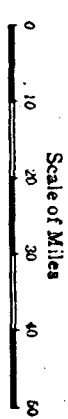
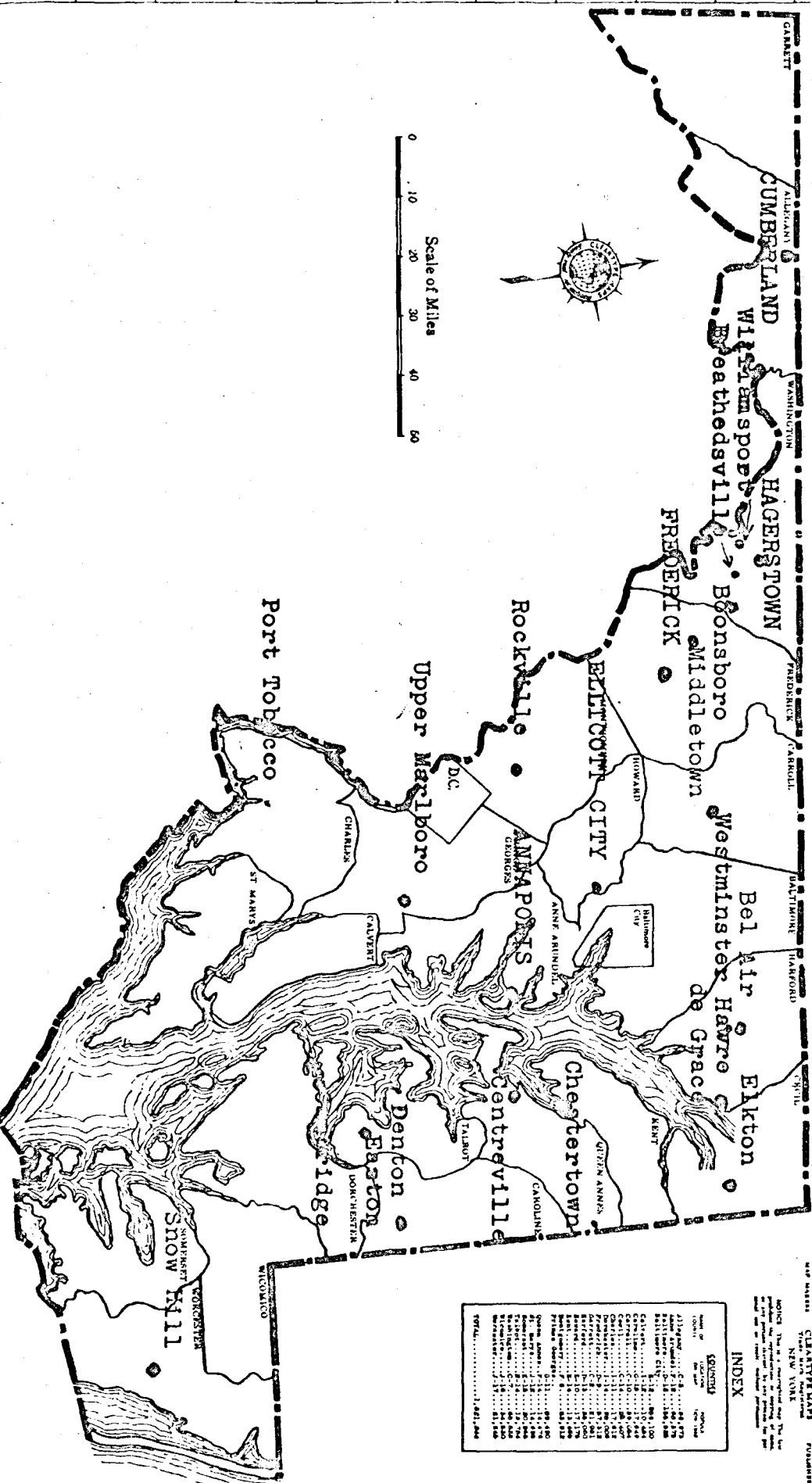
