and the printer could be consolidated as one copy. After comparing this, the next step was to compare these with those of the National Union Catalog. Many more titles were found being only present in one title, and to be eliminated. The next step was to check the American Bibliography. A large many of the imprints were located in the Library of Congress itself, but the greatest number were to be found in the Library of Maryland State School Library in Annapolis. Concerning the direct historical material, the Library of the First State Library, and the Library of the State of Maryland in Baltimore. Special trips to Baltimore were necessary to check the records of the State Library. Letters were sent to a number of librarians, and the entire material was prepared for the printing of imprints. INTRODUCTION

Strange as it may seem, considering the volume of printing done in
Maryland for this period, there is a dearth of information on the history of
printing for the state. The fire in Baltimore in 1831 destroyed a mass of the

The following check-list of imprints of the State of Maryland for the
years 1831-1834 is but one step further towards the completion of a national
bibliography. After completing only four years for just one State of the Union,
I can readily appreciate the magnitude of the task in undertaking a national
bibliography.

Beginning with the imprint survey slips on file at the Library of
Congress, the first step was to transcribe the information contained on the
slips onto large cards. In this manner, duplicates of titles could be easily
eliminated, and all locations could be consolidated on one card. After
completing this, the next step was to compare these cards with those in the
National Union Catalog. Many more titles were found during this process, and
some titles had to be eliminated. The next step was to check the imprints
themselves. A great many of the imprints were located in the Library of Congress
itself, but the greatest number were to be found in the Library of Maryland
Historical Society in Baltimore. Complementing the Maryland Historical Society's
holdings, are those of the Enoch Pratt Free Library, and the Peabody Institute,
both located in Baltimore. Several trips to Baltimore were necessary to check
and re-check certain titles. Letters were sent to a number of Libraries, and
historical societies, where necessary information was lacking on imprints not
located within a short traveling distance from Washington. The response to
these letters of inquiry was almost unanimous in promptitude and detail. In

addition, a number of bibliographies were checked, such as Sabin's Dictionary of Books Relating to America, the British Museum's General Catalogue of Printed Books, Ulrich's Union List of American Newspapers, and Ayer's Directory of Newspapers and Periodicals.

Strange as it may seem, considering the volume of printing done in Maryland for this period, there is a dearth of information on the history of printing for that era. The fire in Baltimore in 1904 destroyed many of the records of that period. The years 1820-1850 might be considered the "Dark Ages" of Maryland's printing history. Even the usual histories of Maryland seem to skirt this period as though it were an abyss. For the period up to the War of 1812, and shortly thereafter, there are a number of excellent histories. Then there is a long gap in historical continuity, with but few exceptions, to the Civil War. Many of the histories are labeled 1820-1850, or some other inclusive period, but upon examination the history is concentrated on a small part of the period. Our historians, it seems, write their histories only on a wartime basis.

It is almost needless to say that this check-list is not totally free from error, or that no imprint for that period exists which is not contained in the check-list. Inclusiveness has been attempted, and errors wherever found have been expunged or corrected. To this extent I assume responsibility.

The early history of printing in Maryland began with William Rouse Johnson, who arrived in Annapolis, Maryland, in 1729, and who is credited with the first printing in Maryland, about the year 1733, but his earliest known printing there did not occur until 1740. None of this printing can be traced, however. As a result of the Revolution.

CHAPTER I

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF THE PERIOD

Fatti Maschilli, Parole Femminili, or in English, Manly Deeds, Womanly Words, is the motto of Maryland. Womanly words might be construed to mean a great abundance of words, as well as of choice or delicacy. In the former sense, Maryland truly lived up to its motto during the period 1831-1834. Sixty-three publishers, or printer-publishers worked diligently to produce approximately 715 titles, or more, during that period. In addition, there were many newspapers and magazines printed.

The printing center of Maryland for this period was confined to a small area in Baltimore. This does not mean that there was not a good deal of printing elsewhere in the state, but the greatest number of publishers were concentrated in Baltimore, and in Baltimore, they seemed to gravitate towards Market and Calvert Streets. In Baltimore alone, there were fifty-five publishers. Annapolis had a roster of three publishers. Three publishers were located in Hagerstown, and Frederick and Princess-Anne each claimed one publisher. According to a table in The Book in America, by Lehmann-Haupt, during the period 1820-1852, which covers this paper's period, Baltimore had thirty-two publishers, and this figure included publishers or printer-publishers only, not booksellers, or bookbinders.¹ So many of the publishers were printers, and vice versa, that it is difficult to tell definitely what category they are in. To avoid this distinction, printers, publishers, and printer-publishers are all included in the figure sixty-three, as given earlier. Separation of printer and publisher had not been achieved at this date to the extent that it is today.

The early history of printing in Maryland began with William Nuthead who was driven out of Jamestown, Virginia, by a decree of the Governor of Virginia, which forbade printing activity in the colony. Nuthead arrived in St. Mary's, Maryland, about the year 1683, but his earliest known printing there did not occur until 1686. None of this printing can be traced, however. As a result of the Protestant Revolution in 1689, Nuthead printed the manifesto of Col. John Coode, who with others overthrew the proprietary government of Maryland. This is known only indirectly by a London edition of the manifesto in the same year. "This broadside is the last as well as the first known product of the Nuthead press to exist today, and only two other titles are known even circumstantially now."² Nuthead died about February 1695, and his widow, Dinah, carried on. She moved from St. Mary's to Annapolis in Anne Arundel County. No specimens of her work are known to exist.

William Bladen is recognized as the third printer in Maryland, though he was more of a director of a printing plant, than a printer. Bladen did accomplish much, though. "In association with Bray, he published the first edition of the Maryland laws in 1700 and thereby filled an unpleasant gap in Maryland legal history."³ Even though this was a government subsidized scheme, the counties to subscribe for the laws and repay the publisher in tobacco, Bladen abandoned the printing business in the following year, 1701. Thomas Reading, his printer, continued to publish and compile the laws, but as with Bladen, found the business of printing not too remunerative, and in May 1713, died a poor man. There followed a long interval during which Maryland had no printer. Philadelphia was relied on for Maryland's printing needs. In 1722, Michael Piper petitioned for permission to print the laws. The legislature of Maryland eagerly accepted the offer, but then Piper failed to print them, possibly because it was not a paying proposition. Some time after this, William Parks came to Maryland and established what was considered its most

important press, and for years regarded as the first press in Maryland. The Maryland Assembly recognized Parks, and the duties and salary of Public Printer were fixed by law. Printing was put on a business-like basis for the first time and thereafter flourished.⁴

"For about ninety years from the date of the first printing in Maryland, the press of that province clung to the western shore of Chesapeake Bay - first at St. Mary's city, later at Annapolis and Baltimore. Not until the Revolution was well on its way did it seek a location further inland."⁵ In 1779 Matthias Bartgis established a press in Frederick, and on the Eastern Shore, in 1790, James Cowan brought his press to Easton. Hagerstown, which is about twenty-five miles northwest of Frederick, lists Stewart Herbert as its first printer, probably about 1790. Herbert died in 1795 and was succeeded by John Gruber, who started a German newspaper there.⁶ Chestertown, on the Eastern Shore, also had a printer about this time.

The famous Green family was represented in Maryland in the person of Jonas Green. Jonas Green I came to Annapolis in 1738 to accept the appointment as Printer to the Province. He held this office until his death in 1767. On January 17, 1745, he began a newspaper called the Maryland Gazette. This paper was published by him and his descendants until December 12, 1839, "a period of more than ninety-four years, which is believed to be the record for the continuous publication of an American newspaper by a single family."⁷ William Rind, who was a partner of Green for eight years, is believed to have been Maryland's first native-born printer.

After the death of Jonas Green I, his grandson, Jonas Green II continued the Gazette and the printing office until his death in 1839. The Gazette was then discontinued. Jonas Green II was one of the last printers in the family of printers established nearly two hundred years earlier.

"After the passing of the older Jonas Green, the typographic center of

gravity in Maryland shifted from Annapolis to the younger city of Baltimore, which soon became the chief city of the province".⁸

Baltimore's printing history begins with Nicholas Hasselbach, who brought the first press to Baltimore in 1765. In 1765, Baltimore was a very small village, with less than 5,000 population. When one looks at Baltimore today, it is hard to realize and visualize it as once being a village of less than 5,000 people. Its population in 1775 was a scant 5,934.⁹ In 1800 it had a population of over 26,000. In 1830, one year earlier than the beginning of the period of this report, Baltimore numbered over 80,000 inhabitants.¹⁰ To record this growth, as well as the events of the times, the Maryland Journal and Baltimore Advertiser came into existence. The title of this newspaper was later changed to the Baltimore American. The "record of the American is a unique one. There may be a weekly which traces its history back a little further and there are a few dailies which began before the close of the eighteenth century, but there is not a daily newspaper in this hemisphere which can in all its names and records go as far back as August 20, 1773, when the first American, then known as the Journal, made its appearance".¹¹ The Baltimore American, like any good newspaper, had a number of "firsts". The Declaration of Independence was officially printed in its office. The National Anthem was first published in the American, too. The paper was founded by William Goddard, who was notable in other fields, namely as the founder of our modern postal system. The paper at its inception was published regularly every week. On the first of November 1793, the Journal became a tri-weekly. A year later, November 1, 1794, it became a daily. During the period 1831-1834, the paper was controlled and published by Robert A. Dobbin, Thomas Murphy, and William Bose. Today, the American appears only on Sundays, as the Sunday edition of the News-Post, a Hearst paper. Today, the News-Post daily sells for five cents a copy, and the Sunday edition of the American sells for ten cents.

At one time the American sold for one dollar a copy.

The American was not the only periodical of importance being printed in Baltimore at that time. A popular weekly called the Saturday Visiter began operations in 1832. The Saturday Visiter ... "fixed its name in literary history in the following year (1833) by awarding a hundred-dollar prize to a short story contest to an unknown by the the name of Edgar A. Poe, for a tale called 'A Manuscript Found in a Bottle'".¹² The Visiter came to a bad end as far as the pro-slavery interests were concerned. It turned antislavery, and was merged into Dr. Bailey's abolition paper, the National Era of Washington, sometime in 1847. Another very important periodical, which began its existence in 1811, was Miles' Weekly Register. As with the distinction between publisher and printer, so too, is it difficult to distinguish between what is a newspaper and what is a magazine. Since the Register is not listed in Gregory's Union List of American Newspapers, it is safe to assume that it was a magazine, though it appeared weekly as did many newspapers.

Miles' Register reflects the spirit of the times, not only in Baltimore, but throughout the United States. The United States in the 1830's could not be described as other than a young giant, a new nation growing by leaps and bounds, proud of its early history, and eager for the future. Railroads made their appearance; ships were being built at an unprecedented rate; President Andrew Jackson was busy convincing South Carolina not to secede from the Union; and at the same time was trying to convince the rest of the United States that the Bank of the United States was unnecessary. Politics were, putting it mildly, "rough and tumble", and violently partisan. The newspapers of the period often reflected their partisanship, as for example, the quotation in Miles Register from the New York Commercial Advertiser in 1831, regarding the dispute between William H. Crawford, a Cabinet member, and Vice President Calhoun:

The residue of Mr. Crawford's strictures upon the vice president arrived this morning, and the publication therefore is completed in this paper. We have not published this precious specimen of imbecile garrulity because it possesses either interest or value, but simply to maintain our own character for impartiality, which must not be questioned. Fortunately this country is yet so free that nobody is obliged to read it.¹³

Foreign affairs for this period consisted largely in criticizing the British, especially in regard to the tariff, which in turn produced one of the most bitter and lengthy disputes in the United States on protection versus free trade. Niles' Register favored protection, and there is hardly an issue which does not mention it. Most of Niles' comments on protection were serious, but occasionally he would twit his foes, such as his "Export of Females" article:

The British government is now devising plans to send out to the colonists unmarried females between the ages of eighteen and thirty-two ... As the export is only contemplated to the colonies, we do not know that this country is particularly interested in the scheme; but the case may easily be imagined in which a 'protective duty' would be necessary, if many of the unmarried females should find their way to this country. ... The idea is, nevertheless, somewhat laughable, and if we were among the colonists, and a score of years younger, we should inquire closely whether the consignments equalled the warranty of the bills of lading, viz:- 'in good order and well conditioned.'¹⁴

Along with protection for domestic industry, there were other vital issues of the day. Temperance, slavery, immigration, and the prevalence of cholera, occupied a great many pages of the press of that day. Much of the printing about these subjects was in the form of a pamphlet, rather than in book form.

The field which provided publishers and printers of this period with the greatest amount of work was government publications. Reports of committees, journals of proceedings, compilations of the laws, and a variety of subjects concerning government, both State and city, kept the presses going. Almost all of the State government's printing was done in Annapolis by three printers. The three printers were Jonas Green, Jeremiah Hughes and William McNeir. During this period, Jonas Green's imprints covered the years 1831, 1832, and 1833. Imprints for Jeremiah Hughes and William McNeir covered the years 1832, 1833, and 1834. It would appear that during the year 1831, Jonas Green was the only printer in

that city, or at least the only printer for the State government. In output, however, Jeremiah Hughes led all three with a total of seventy-two imprints, sixty-eight of which were government publications. Jonas Green had a total of twenty-nine imprints, twenty-six of which were government publications. William McNeir had a total of seventeen imprints, fourteen of which were government publications. It is obvious from this that in Annapolis there was very little printing which was not of a governmental character.

In Baltimore, on the other hand, there was very little government printing. The government printing done there was usually the city government printing, rather than the State government. The largest government publishers in Baltimore were Lucas and Deaver, Sands and Neilson, and William Woddy, all of whom were printing through the years 1831-1834. Much of the government printing they did concerned the Baltimore and Ohio railroad.

Next to government publications, religious publications led the others in output. Of all the publishers during this period, at least thirty-one published or printed some religious publication. There was a total of 132 religious publications printed throughout the period. Bibles, sermons, exercise texts, catechisms, and novels with a religious tone made up the bulk of the publications. Bibles were a staple in the trade, since they were usually put out in large numbers and in many editions. As with government publishers, the religious publications field had several outstanding leaders. They in turn, could be broken down by religion. The outstanding leader in this field for the period was Fielding Lucas, Jr., who published Roman Catholic items exclusively. Among the twenty-two Catholic imprints published by him during the period, were two Bibles and one Missal. The Protestant leader was John J. Harrod, who was the publisher and agent for the Methodist Protestant Church. Fifteen different titles had his imprint, five of which were Bibles. Secondary leaders in this field were the printers Armstrong and Plaskitt with fourteen imprints, Lucas

and Deaver with nine imprints, James Myres with eight imprints, Joseph N. Lewis with seven imprints, and John D. Toy with seven imprints. All of these publishers and printers were active throughout the period.

Almanaca of all sorts and descriptions were popular, and were published by twelve different publishers and printers. Some were published in German. The calculator for most of these almanacs was Charles Frederick Egelmann, whose name appears on at least five different almanacs. It seems as though he was the only one at the time who knew when Leap Year would arrive, and when Philadelphia was due for high water. The largest publishers of almanacs were Johann T. Hanzsche of Baltimore, who published three different almanacs, one in German, and John Gruber of Hagerstown, who also published three different almanacs, two of which were in German.

In the field of Music, there are four outstanding names. All were located in Baltimore. Leading the field is Joseph N. Robinson, who published music for plays in theatres, primarily. Fifteen of his imprints in Music for this period have been located. George F. Willig, Jr., had a total of fourteen imprints; John Cole, a total of nine imprints; and E. J. Coale, a total of seven imprints. Hardly anyone else published music, since there were only forty-nine imprints of music for the entire period.

Biography, history and travel had no outstanding publisher. There were a total of forty-four imprints located, and twenty-one different publishers contributed to this total. Outstanding authors in this field were William Grimshaw, who wrote the History of France, and the Life of Napoleon; Bishop Davenport, who compiled a Gazetteer, which had three editions; and Mrs. Mary Austin Holley, whose Texas Observations must have been very popular, judging from the great number of locations which possess copies.

School books ranked fifth in output for all fields. A total of forty-two imprints were located. Among the most popular authors, Samuel Griswold

Goodrich has six different titles to his credit. Geography was prominent among these titles. He also wrote anonymously the Peter Parley's Tales about South America and Great Britain. Another author of school books was Edward Hazen, who was responsible for the Speller and Definer; or, Class-book no. 2. Ira Irvins Hitchcock developed a new method of teaching book-keeping, and as a result there was published a book on how to teach this "art". By the year 1831, it had reached six editions. Lyman Cobb's Juvenile Readers were "designed for the use of small children", and also, "for the use of larger children", in families and schools.

No one publisher is outstanding in the field of school books. William and Joseph Neal, and Cushing and Sons, each published six different titles. George McDowell and Son, and Joseph Jewett, each published five titles.

Addresses ranging from nullification of Federal law by the states to the slavery issue were made during this period, and many of them were printed. Thirty-five imprints were located. John D. Toy, Sands and Neilson, and Lucas and Deaver printed most of them.

Ranking eighth in number of imprints located, is the field of Technical and Medical books. Four of the medical books were about cholera, and how to prevent and treat it. This was bound to be a popular subject, since in 1832, there were 853 cholera deaths in Baltimore alone.¹⁵ New York had 1,982 deaths from cholera just for the month of July in the same year.¹⁶ Here too, there was no single, outstanding publisher. Thirteen different publishers and printers shared the output of twenty-four titles.

In the last definite field, Literature, the leading publisher is William and Joseph Neal who published seven different titles. Plutarch's Lives, which enjoyed an edition each year of this period, was published by the Neal firm. It was translated from the original Greek into English by John and William Langhorn. There were not many classics published during this period. Poems of one sort or

another made up the balance of imprints. In all there was a total of twenty-three imprints for this class.

If one had to name the outstanding printers and publishers for the period 1831-1834, mathematically, it would be as follows:

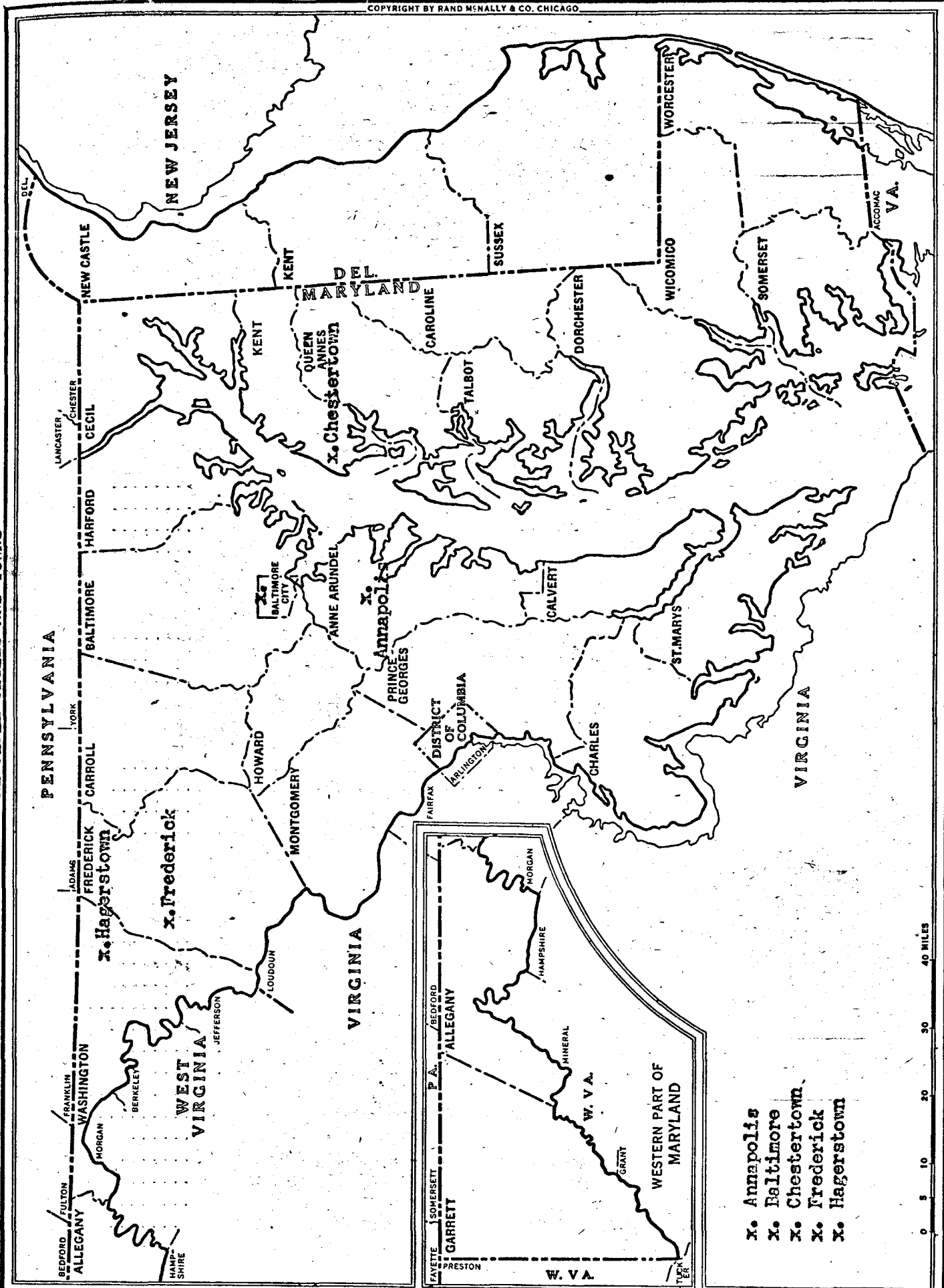
