This study attempts to continue the record of Maryland Printing, covering the years 1850-1852. It forms a segment of a project begun by the American Imprints Inventory to compile a complete national bibliography. A vast amount of information was gathered by the Inventory concerning printing and publishing throughout the country. This check-list has been compiled from that valuable collection of material.

The bibliography of imprints contains all the titles and locations as found in the National Union Catalog of the Library of Congress, the Maryland Historical Society Library, the Peabody Institute of Baltimore, and the Maryland Room of the Enoch Pratt Free Library, and the titles which were located in libraries scattered over the nation. An attempt was made to verify the information whenever possible.

The historical introduction of the period from 1850 through 1852 was designed to present a picture of the prevailing conditions of politics, economics, and the social life of Maryland during that period. This is followed by a survey of the persons actively engaged in printing and publishing in the various towns and cities of Maryland during the period, brief biographical accounts, and comments on the types of material which formed the output of their presses.

The arrangement of the check-list is by year, and under year by author. If the author is not known, the title serves as main entry. The Library of Congress rules have been followed for entry and capitalization. The symbols for the location of the titles are those used in the Union

Catalog of the Library of Congress. A key to the location of the libraries to which the symbols refer precedes the bibliography of imprints.

MARYLAND, 1850-1852

The effects of the Mexican War were still being felt in 1850, in that not a few Marylanders met their death in the War which ended on February 2, 1848.¹ Veterans were received with honors and the State felt that, although its numerical representation was small, its achievements were vastly out of proportion to its numbers. The territory gained by the United States through the War was a gain in geographical area, but it afforded new opportunities for friction when the great issue of slavery extension sundered the counsels of a great and free people. Maryland's part in the acquirement of that territory was indeed another contribution of the State towards that problem, but, also, towards the crowning glory of ultimate American union and progress.²

The great overshadowing question in Maryland, as well as throughout the country generally, was that which resulted in the breakup of the old political parties and the recasting of affiliations--the question of slavery. Maryland's sympathies went with her Southern sisters. Nevertheless, the position which that state was to occupy upon the gravest subject in the country's entire history was forecast by division of sentiment which was significantly shown by an assemblage of citizens presided over by the Mayor of Baltimore. These facts make a recital of the place of the State in the mighty movements of the time more difficult than that of any other State in the union.³

There were many slaves and slave-owners in the State, but on the other hand there was a large Puritan element in the population whose sympathies were more or less with the North. Moreover, there were many later

settlers in the northern and western counties, many of them industrious and thrifty Germans, holding smaller farms, and accustomed, man, woman, and child, to do their own work. These also were anti-slavery in feeling. Thus the State which lies on the border between North and South was divided in feeling, sympathy, and interests on the matters of difference between the two sections.⁴

The first Negroes were brought to Maryland shortly after the settlement of the colony. Their number was small until the early years of the eighteenth century, when the importation of them was increased rapidly, so that by 1850, when the white population numbered about four hundred eighteen thousand, five hundred and ninety, there were ninety thousand, three hundred sixty-eight slaves.⁵ Slave trade declined after 1810, until in 1860 slaves and free Negroes stood with respect to each other as 50.95 and 49.05. There was only one section of the State in which it was not being depleted rapidly. The total Negro population in 1850 represented twenty-eight per cent of the total population in the State, with seventy-four thousand, seventy-seven being free Negroes.⁶ As early as the year 1789 a society was formed in Maryland having for its object the abolition of slavery. The Friends or Quakers were active in their efforts to have slavery abolished.⁷

The growth of the free was indirectly affected by the escape of slaves to free territory and sales of others to the traders to southern markets. From 1830 to 1850, the total gain of the free Negro population was thirty-eight per cent. Many efforts were made to reduce the number of free Negroes in Maryland. Beginning with the year 1831, the State appropriated large sums to send them to the colony of Liberia. The movement met with little success, however, as the Negroes did not wish to go. In the twenty years to 1851, only one thousand and eleven were colonized in Africa. Many

slaves had been manumitted by their masters, so that the number of slaves in the State was greatly diminishing.⁸

The position of the free Negro was anomalous. They were played upon by a complex of forces, some of which, arising outside the State, were met and crossed by internal counter-forces. They themselves were impotent; they went hither and thither as they were impelled. The shifting from one legal category to another left Negro persons unaltered with respect to fitness for the station they had attained. It did not make them independent of doles from the larders; it did not essentially change their occupations, their abodes, or their diversions; it failed to raise their intellect above those of the slaves with whom they continued to associate and consort. When the "evil" of their numbers increased, the statutory provisions affecting their activities increased also. They were systematically excluded from the most desirable occupations and in the rest they were subjected to oppressive conditions. Their energies were devoted chiefly to common labor.⁹

At first the Abolitionists did not form any political party, but before long they merged into the Republican party which took up the watchword of "no slavery."¹⁰

The decade, beginning in 1850, was termed the political era. In connection with the agitation for political reforms, but, preceding the most significant developments in the new political parties was the campaign for the creation of a new Constitution for Maryland. It was endorsed by the Governor, Philip F. Thomas, whose emphatic language in advocating constitutional reform had its effect upon the General Assembly. A "reform bill" passed both houses in February, 1850. This measure provided for a special election "to take the sense of the people" upon the calling of a State

convention. The popular vote was overwhelming in favor of the calling of the Convention.¹¹ In the election for governor, Enoch Louis Lowe, the Democratic candidate, received a majority of the votes. John H. T. Jerome, a Whig candidate, was elected Mayor of Baltimore city.

The Constitutional Convention assembled in Annapolis on March 4, 1850. After a tedious session of over six months, it adopted a new constitution and adjourned on May 13, 1851. There were some new praiseworthy features, but altogether, it was considered an unsatisfactory document and was adopted as a compromise measure. It was never passed in legal form. By the provisions of the new Constitution, the judges of the several courts were to be elected by the people; imprisonment for debt was abolished; lotteries were declared illegal; biennial sessions of the Legislature were established; all fees of any office in excess of three thousand dollars were to be paid into the State treasury; representation of the counties in the Legislature was to conform to the changes in the population; Baltimore City was separated from the County. It further provided for a division of the State into three districts, one consisting of eight Eastern Shore counties; the second of seven counties surrounding Baltimore City and the City; and the six western counties, forming the third district. Also, the Governor was to be elected in rotation from each district; and there was the division of the State into four judicial districts and eight judicial circuits.¹²

For the next few years, there were two new issues which absorbed the attention of the people of the State of Maryland. Briefly, these issues were the rise of the American, or Knownothing party; and the lawlessness and rioting which was injuring the reputation of Baltimore and seriously threatening the growth and prosperity of the great commercial center of the State.

The latter issue runs into a later period than this sketch aims to cover; however, the writer feels that it is of sufficient significance to present a brief picture of the course of this political landmark. The origin of the American party was fundamentally a movement of protest against political conditions in the great centers of population. It was a secret political party which had considerable influence on politics in Baltimore as well as in other parts of the State, and in the whole country. The main object of this party was to exclude all foreign-born citizens, and more especially all Catholics, from any office under the National, State, or city governments. Its second aim was to change the naturalization laws so that the immigrant could not have the rights of citizenship until a residence of fifteen or twenty years in the country.

Much of the disorder and turbulence of election was properly attributed to the saloons and uncontrolled drinking. In 1851, Maine passed a liquor law, which caused widespread discussion throughout the Republic. This early prohibition enactment had its echo in Baltimore when the "friends of the Maine Liquor Law" elected delegates to the General Assembly on a platform which denounced the manufacture, sale, and consumption of intoxicating liquors. In the cities, the element which appeared most involved in the practices of the saloons and in the "herding" of voters was foreign-born and largely Roman Catholic; hence, the cleavage began to assume sharp racial and religious aspects. The indictment brought forward by the American party was sound enough; no one could deny the evils complained of; but as it turned out, the evils this party set out to correct were excelled, in Baltimore, at least, by the subsequent practices of those who came to control the party machinery.¹³

The framers of the Constitution had feared these outbreaks of popular passion; they had striven to avoid religious dissensions on political lines, and moral issues on sectional bases. But their labors had been in vain; and the far-sighted Jefferson, who was not present at the Convention which created the Constitution, forecast disaster as early as 1820, when he saw the cloud of sectarian and sectional division appear upon the horizon.

By 1855, the Party was sweeping the State and the Governor, Thomas Ligon, took note of the situation in his formal address by referring to secret political societies. This led to the formation of a committee in the General Assembly to investigate and report whether the society was known to encourage purposes which tended to the subversion of the government and to ascertain the power and character of any such societies. The majority of the committee attacked the political views of the Governor and defended the party under attack. The minority reported that the alleged efforts of the Party were to establish "papal supremacy." This led to the consideration of the increase and culmination of the second menace which occupied the minds of thoughtful citizens to the exclusion of other matters, i.e., mob-rule, which reached its climax under the Know-nothing rule.¹⁴

While the slavery question and that of political reform were uppermost in men's minds during the years before the war of secession, they did not constitute the whole history of the period. Two of the most striking features of this period were the enormous growth in population due to immigration, and the equally large increase in material welfare. It was a time of mechanical inventions: the harvesting machine, the breech-loading fire-arm, the sewing machine, the steam fire-engine; the Atlantic cable; all belong to this period; and the growth of material welfare was largely due to

inventions of this kind.¹⁵ The gloom which had overspread the State in regard to the public debt was, under the administration of Governor Thomas, entirely removed and Maryland was restored to the high and honorable position from which she had temporarily fallen. Her credit was entirely restored, and her creditors reposed, with full confidence in her disposition and ability to discharge her obligations with punctuality. Maryland's stocks were once more sought after by capitalists of this country and Europe as a secure and profitable investment.¹⁶

The growth of material welfare was further due to the use of steam in manufactures and railroads. It is noteworthy that in 1852, the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad was finished as far as the Ohio River at Wheeling in Virginia.¹⁷

The territorial extent of Maryland in 1850 was nine thousand, three hundred and fifty-six square miles. It was the fourteenth largest state, with a total population of five hundred eighty-three thousand, and thirty-five. Fifty-three thousand, seven hundred and fifty of the white population were of foreign birth. This group comprised twelve per cent. Persons engaged in industries comprised the largest category of those employed. The second category was that of those engaged in unskilled manual labor. The third consisted of planters and farmers. The totals of the trades and professions numbered three hundred.¹⁸

In the realm of education, not until the close of the nineteenth century did Maryland obtain wide renown for her higher institutions of learning; yet the number and importance have been too great to justify such neglect as they have received. Early conditions of life in the State were not such as to favor schools or colleges.¹⁹ In 1850, the colleges in Maryland numbered

twelve, with a total of ninety-five teachers and one thousand, one hundred and twelve students. Among the institutions of higher learning at that time were the Second University of Maryland; Saint John's College at Annapolis, which had existed since 1785; the Baltimore Female College; Washington College at Chestertown; Loyola in Baltimore, which was founded in 1852; and Mount Saint Mary's College at Emmitsburg.

The public schools throughout the State numbered nine hundred and twenty-three, with one thousand and four teachers and a total of thirty-four thousand, four hundred and sixty-seven pupils. Academies and other schools numbered one hundred and seventy-four.

There were nine hundred and nine churches of all denominations in the State in 1850. Ninety-nine of these were located in Baltimore. There were seven hundred and seventy-nine protestant churches and sixty-five Roman Catholic churches listed in the census for that year. Other churches numbered sixty-five. Aggregate accommodations totalled three hundred nine thousand, four hundred and sixty-five persons.²⁰

The nation-wide improvements in education greatly influenced the intellectual and cultural events in Maryland. The development of public education made the nation one of readers. Illiteracy was about nine per cent during the years, 1850-1852.²¹ Miscellaneous societies, associations, clubs, and institutions which promoted the cultural and intellectual activities in the State included the Library Company of Baltimore which had existed since 1796. It later transferred its volumes to the Maryland Historical Society. There was the Mercantile Library Association in Baltimore since 1839. Its founders felt the necessity for greater facilities for mental improvement. In addition, the Maryland Institute School of Design was begun in 1849 by

George Peabody, a London financier, who later founded the Peabody Institute in Baltimore. The YMCA was established in Baltimore in 1852. The Maryland Institute for the Promotion of the Mechanic Arts held its third exhibition in 1850 which was remarkably successful. The Institute was founded in 1825.²²

As can be noted from the preceding paragraph, the bulk of activities in the cultural area were centered in Baltimore. Notable among the persons in the fields of literature, music, art, etc., was the name of John P. Kennedy, a lawyer; member of the House of Delegates, and one who was active in the establishment of the Peabody Institute. He further participated in the Delphian Club of Baltimore, which was devoted to musical, literary, and artistic activities. There was the famous Jenny Lind whose concerts were quite popular during this time.²³ Another Maryland name of eminence belonging to this period was that of Edgar Allan Poe. He was born in Boston, but he was of an old and prominent Baltimore family. He has been acclaimed as one of the most gifted writers America has produced. A monument was later erected to him in Baltimore by the teachers and pupils of the public schools.²⁴

A study of the local imprints will further yield an excellent picture of the trends, events, thoughts, and aspirations of Marylanders during the period, 1850-1852.

MARYLAND PRINTING, 1850-1852

As one would expect, great strides had been made in the field of printing in Maryland since the first press was established in what was then the colony of Maryland by William Nuthead in 1695.¹ The years, 1850-1852, form a portion of a stage in the history of American journalism known as the period of the "party press", extending from 1833 until 1860.² This period was so called because it was the partisan political press that dominated American journalism. This political partisanship sprang from the increasing interest in public affairs with the introduction of the democratic political system. Men began to take their politics seriously, and the chief source of political information was the newspaper. In many respects these years formed a period of social and economic awakening and of reform movement.³

Several causes combined to bring about a rapid growth in Maryland printing and in readership during the years 1850-1852, as in the nation as a whole. In the first place, the population of the state multiplied approximately two times during a period of seventeen years, from 1833 to 1850. The 1850 census of Maryland revealed a population of 583,035 persons.⁴ Secondly, there was the spectacular phenomenon, the advent of the penny paper, with its addition of a new economic level of the population to the newspaper audience. This was, in turn, due largely to improvements in presses and papermaking machinery. Newspapers, especially, promptly recognized and adopted improvements in machinery which enabled the presses to achieve remarkable successes during these years. Hand-presses were supplanted by the rotary cylinder.⁵ The demand for additional presses could be met more easily, for industries were expanding and thus it was increasingly easy to obtain the materials for

printing. A third basis for the popularity of reading was the development of public education throughout the nation. Illiteracy was greatly reduced. Not to be disregarded as a factor in the development of the reading habit was the improvement in home facilities such as that of lighting, the coming of oil lamps and gas lighting.

7 As has been mentioned previously, a fourth and very important cause of the increased demand for printing was the great interest which men began to take in the political scene. Political partisanship was almost inescapable. Even the penny papers were infected by it, just as the mercantile papers were. The 1850 census for the nation listed only five per cent of the newspapers as "neutral".⁶ The 1850 census for Maryland lists Maryland as having 68 newspapers, with 39 being of a political nature. The Whigs maintained a majority, their advantage being due to the fact that most of the advertising came from the mercantile classes.⁷

These developments, when aided by the new speed in communication furnished by a rapidly advancing mechanical age, produced nothing less than a revolution in news. The emphasis on timeliness, as a feature of news had begun before the era of the penny papers; but it was these papers, with their great resources derived from big circulations and resultant advertising, which were able to push enterprise in speed to a degree which amazed even themselves. These results were obtained, of course, through the utilization of three "miracles" of nineteenth-century communication--the steamship, the railroad, and the magnetic telegraph. The Baltimore papers--especially the Sun--played a large part in all these efforts to develop speed in news transmission. They were favorably situated to use the earliest railroad line--the Baltimore

and Ohio, as well as that first telegraph wire strung from Washington to Baltimore.⁸

There may be noted a trend during this period, 1850-1852, toward the classing or categorization of printed material. In addition to the newspapers, books, and pamphlets which can be directly accounted for by the clashes between political parties, the publications may be categorized as being religious, agricultural, musical, those pertaining to colonization, and miscellaneous.

As the bibliography will show, the character of the publications was as divergent as the growing population which they served. Wroth's History of Printing in Colonial Maryland shows that the first printing presses existed mainly for the recording and distribution of the laws, and the early bibliography of the Maryland press reveals legal documents and forms to be principal and at times the only output. During and since the colonial period, the use of the press expanded constantly and the types of books and other material issued locally has become increasingly varied. As is apparent in the bibliography, there were during the years 1850-1852, the laws and ordinances, books on timely subjects, political pamphlets, sermons and addresses preached on momentous occasions, recreational and popular instructive reading such as songs and verse, with and without music, books of rules and proceedings of local organizations, religious tracts, medical books, school texts, and the ephemeral newspapers, periodicals and broadsides. In addition there are many publications which seem to bear no relationship to the local or contemporary scene.

The City of Baltimore had the greatest concentration of printers and publishers in the State; thus, the greatest output of publications in

all categories. The imprint of John Murphy appears more frequently than any other Baltimore publisher during this period. He was a descendant of Thomas Murphy, the predecessor of the line of Murphy publishers in Baltimore. Thomas Murphy was a member of the old firm of Dobbin, Murphy, and Bose which had been in existence for nearly half a century, and dissolved in 1853. The firm continued under the proprietorship of Robert A. Dobbin until his death in 1862. Dobbin had been connected with the American paper for over 33 years. The third member of the firm, William Bose, was connected with the American from 1815 to 1853 and was active manager for many years.⁹

Contemporary newspapers pay many tributes to the worth of the Murphys, their enterprises, and their social qualities.

Another notable imprint during the period was that of the Lucas Brothers, James and Fielding, or, independently as Fielding Lucas and James Lucas. Biographical information about Fielding Lucas was more prevalent. He was a native Virginian who first entered business in Philadelphia and then in 1806 in Baltimore, formed the firm of Conrad, Lucas, & Co., of which he shortly became the sole proprietor. His books, unfortunately, present a prime bibliographical puzzle, for very many of them, after 1820, contain no date of publication and the records of the firm were all destroyed in the Great Fire of 1906. He also operated a type foundry, from which he made a fortune, but during his long career he never printed any of his own books. His works during this period seem to be predominantly Catholic. He published Catholic books as early as 1816. An interesting note about his life is that he was received into the Catholic Church as he lay dying in 1854, and was buried from the Cathedral in Baltimore.¹⁰

The name of Joseph Robinson appears on many Baltimore books during this period. A General in the War of 1812, he was a native of Frederick, Maryland, born in 1787. He maintained a circulating library as early as 1810. He was not a Catholic; however, he published many Catholic books in addition to Robinson's Magazine and the True Catholic, a monthly magazine, devoted to the cause of the Protestant Episcopal Church, having existed since 1834.¹¹

Another outstanding publisher and printer of Baltimore was Samuel Sands who published in addition to many books, The Farmer and Gardener, a Democratic weekly, during the forties and fifties. This paper was finally suspended in 1862 because of the interruption of intercourse with the South.¹²

Other publishers of Baltimore whose names complete the list of the most prominent book publishers and whose imprints appear on varied types of material were John D. Toy, who published the American Turf Register and Sporting Magazine as well as numerous books; the firm of Armstrong and Berry, the Sherwood Co., P. J. Hedian, who published also The Catholic Mirror, the leading Catholic newspaper in the United States at that time; T. Newton Kurtz, whose imprint appears on the majority of works pertaining to the Lutheran Church during this period.

There was a notable quantity of printing done throughout the State in the German language. The list of Baltimore German publishers includes the names of J. W. Muller, J. T. Hanzsche, and the firm of Maas and Cursch.

Outstanding Baltimore music publishers were George Willig, F. D. Benteen, the Miller & Beacham Co., Henry McCaffrey, and W. C. Peters, who specialized in the printing of music and works about music. He, too, was a composer.¹³

The City of Baltimore also led in the realm of newspaper printing and publishing in the State during this period. There were approximately 23 newspapers and magazines being published in Baltimore during this three year period. Among the more prominent papers was the Baltimore American and Daily Advertiser which was first published in 1799. This paper is the oldest newspaper in Maryland. Another was the Patriot, first issued in 1812, and owned since 1849 by John F. McJilton. There was the Maryland Censor, a Democratic weekly, which changed its name to the Farmer and Gardener and was published during this period by Samuel Sands. The Baltimore Republican was begun in 1827 and in 1850 was owned by William H. Hope. John D. Toy, a prominent printer, acted in that capacity for the American Turf Register and Sporting Magazine, a monthly journal which had existed since 1829. He was also the printer of The Mutual Rights, with E. Yates Reese, as editor.¹⁴ The still famous Sun was founded in 1837 by A. S. Abell, who was still proprietor in 1852. It was then, as now, considered the leading daily paper of Baltimore. It was the design of the proprietor that The Sun should be a newspaper entirely different. It extended at an early its system of "horse-express", and by "nag, rail, and otherwise" collected the news and laid the election returns before its readers at the earliest possible times. The proprietors began the erection of the Sun Iron Building in 1850, the first iron building erected in the United States.¹⁵

The Baltimore Clipper was begun in 1839 by the John H. Hewitt Co. and was a weekly paper. Der Deutsche Correspondent, a German Language daily, was abreast of its contemporaries in ability, energy, and enterprise. It exerted an influence among the very large German population and made the paper a recognized factor in the direction and formation of public opinion.

It published important official documents, municipal, State, and national. Joseph Robinson published The True Catholic, a monthly magazine pertaining to the Protestant Episcopal Church. A fine literary paper was The Western Continent which began in 1846. The True Union, a religious paper, began in 1849, and was an organ of the Baptist Union Association. The German Baltimore Herald began in 1850, and was a tri-weekly.

Other Baltimore newspapers included the Maryland Reformer, a Democratic campaign paper which began in 1850; the Baltimore and Ohio American Musical Gazette published by W. C. Peters; the Sunday Morning Dispatch, a weekly begun in 1851; the Daily Morning News, devoted to Whig principles, begun in 1851; The Flag of Liberty, a weekly Whig paper; The Times, a daily penny journal begun in 1852. There was the Parthenian, or, Young Ladies' Magazine which was founded in 1852; The Old Defender, a weekly Whig campaign paper was begun in the same year. The Catholic Mirror, the leading Catholic newspaper in the United States, was published in 1850 by P. J. Hedian, and was the official organ of the Archbishop of Baltimore. Further, there was the Baltimore Wecker, a daily German paper which was established in 1851.¹⁶

The smaller towns and cities of Maryland, too, boasted of presses which produced books, newspapers, and periodicals, but to a lesser degree, of course. Up to the beginning of the nineteenth century, Annapolis was depended upon as a center for the current news of the day and as a medium for advertising the merchandise and wants of Maryland.¹⁷ Although it remained the capitol city, its prominence decreased after the beginning of the nineteenth century. During the period from 1850 to 1852, the list of printers there included the names of Robert Bonsall, who did some printing for the

State; the firm of Riley and Davis, W. M'Neir, Thomas E. Martin, and James Wingate. Newspapers issued there included the Maryland Free Press, a weekly, which lasted for only four years, from 1848 until 1852; the Maryland Gazette, which had been in existence since 1809; the Maryland Republican, which also had existed since 1809; and the Maryland State Gazette, a weekly, which lasted only a year, from August, 1851, until 1852.

The town of Cambridge had two newspapers, the Cambridge Chronicle, which began in 1822 as a weekly; and the Democrat and News, also a weekly which had existed since 1845.

Cumberland, in the Alleghany area, had four newspapers; the Cumberland Alleganian, a weekly; the Weekly Civilian; the Cumberland Telegraph and Mining Register, again, a weekly which began in 1852; and the Unionist Weekly, established in 1851.

Two political newspapers existed in Elkton; the Cecil Democrat, a weekly, begun in 1842, and the Cecil Whig, too, a weekly, which began the previous year, 1841.

The town of Ellicotts Mills, now Ellicott City, had one publisher, John Scofield, and one newspaper, the Howard Gazette, a weekly.

Frederick, in Western Maryland, boasted of the printing firm of David Schley and Thomas Haller. Three newspapers existed there: the Examiner, a weekly, begun in 1813; the Frederick Herald, also a weekly since 1802; and the New Citizen, a weekly since 1821.¹⁸

Hagerstown, west of the Blue Ridge range, had the first Maryland press in that area. Associated with Hagerstown is the famous Hagerstown Town and Country Almanack, first published there by John (Johann) Gruber, the first German printer of Hagerstown. The almanac still exists and the imprint

still bears the Gruber name. It is the second almanac, in point of age, in the United States. Gruber entered the printing business at the early age of fifteen, as an apprentice in Philadelphia. He also published Die Westliche Correspondenz, a German newspaper. He was actively engaged in the printing business until about 1855, when the infirmities of age forced him to desist. His best known production, the Almanack, survived changes in ownership and operation. During his long career, Gruber trained many young men in the printing business; the most famous was Adam Glossbrenner.¹⁹ The newspapers of Hagerstown included the Weekly Casket, the Herald and Torch Light, a weekly published since 1839 by Thomas Grieves; and the Mail, a weekly begun in 1828.

Port Tobacco had one publisher during this time, Eliah Wells. Its one newspaper was the Port Tobacco Times and Charles County Advertiser, a weekly, established since 1844.²⁰

The other towns of the State made less significant contributions to the field of printing during the period. The writer feels that it is not worthwhile to present a further picture of their productions.

It seems that, on the whole, the period from 1850-1852 was a prosperous one, and one favorable for the growth and expansion of culture and the arts in Maryland.
