INTRODUCTION

This dissertation is concerned with printing in Maryland in the years 1853 and 1854 inclusive. The author wishes to emphasize that this bibliography is really part of a larger project begun by the American Imprints Inventory under the direction of the late Douglas C. McMurtrie, whose aim it was to compile, as nearly complete as possible, a bibliography of American Imprints from 1801 to 1876. The purpose of this dissertation is to present a survey of printing in Maryland for the years 1853 and 1854 inclusive. The check list which follows has been drawn from the results of the work done by the American Imprints Inventory. In addition to using the slips which are deposited by the American Imprints Inventory at the Library of Congress, the card catalogs of the Maryland Historical Society, the Enoch Pratt Free Library, and the National Union Catalog of the Library of Congress were used. When it was thought necessary, letters were sent to holding libraries in order to complete missing bibliographical information.

A brief historical sketch of the social, political, and economic conditions under which the printing was done is presented in the first chapter. An account of the work and brief biographical sketches of the principal printers of this period are given in the second chapter.

The entries are assigned according to the Library of Congress rules for author and title entries and the location symbols indicating where the particular imprint may be located are placed below the individual title. The key to the location of the libraries was drawn from the booklet published by the Library of Congress entitled, Symbols Used in the Union Catalog of the Library of Congress, fifth edition, 1953. A list of private collections follows the key to the symbols.

Arrangement of the check list is by year, and under year alphabetical by author. If the author is not known, or if there is no author the title serves as main entry. The index which follows the check list is arranged alphabetically according to author and title.

CHAPTER I

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF THE PERIOD

Between 1820 and 1860 the history of Maryland is concerned mainly with the development of the feeling of the State on the subject of the slavery issue which was agitating the Union, the adoption of a new constitution, and internal improvements.

From the first, Maryland had been permeated with anti-slavery sentiments since she was separated from the Northern states by a variety of commercial, economic, and social jealousies which had been obvious enough during the War of 1812. Therefore she did not take a favorable attitude upon the growth of the abolition movement in New England, and considered the action of the North as unwarranted meddling. Meanwhile, the condition of the negro slave in Maryland improved rapidly.¹

Before 1840, all persons of color were slaves. In 1790, not quite one out of every fourteen was free. In thirty years from that period 1820 the number of free had increased to 44,730 and bore the proportion of considerably more than one-third of the colored people of the State were free and in 1840 the proportion of the free colored to the slaves was 64 to 69 or more than two fifths of the whole. It will also be seen that for thirty years, from 1810, the number of slaves diminished 21,796.²

Slave holding in Maryland was not looked upon with favor; the people really wanted to do away with slavery altogether. However, a reaction took place, not in public sentiment but in public policy, as a consequence of the improper interference and attitude of the Northern abolitionists. Unfortunately this sentiment brought about the passage of very stringent laws against slaves, at a time when they were being looked upon as free human beings and when the legislature was contemplating

substantial appropriations for the benefit of the colored race. Scharf maintains that Maryland as an exposed and frontier slaveholding State had a more practical interest in adhering to the guarantees of the Constitution with regard to slavery than did South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, and Mississippi.³

As regards the preservation of the Union, Maryland, more than any other state, had a heavier stake proportionately, when one considers her material prosperity. This can be clearly seen when one takes into consideration the sources of her wealth, the nature and direction of her industry and of her commerce, external and internal.⁴ Realizing the value of unity at a time such as this, Maryland consistently refused to send delegates to a Northern or Southern convention which was to deliberate on the propriety of separating the States.⁵

From the period of the American Revolution, the people of Maryland had demonstrated an interest in aiding every undertaking which aimed to encourage and promote the internal resources of the State. This spirit of modern development spread over the entire Union, and we find evidence of it in President Monroe's message to Congress in 1824, when he called attention to the improvement of internal resources as a matter of national concern.⁶ It was during this time that interstate roads and canals were the main topic of discussion. State legislatures and Federal Congress were flooded with projects for development and improvement. In Congress the Cumberland Road and the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal were among the principal objects discussed. However, the main issue involved regular systems of communication from east to west.

The industrial leaders of Maryland were determined to take advantage of their natural geographical location and thus to secure possession of

a fair share of the internal trade of the country. It is interesting to note that during the first half of the nineteenth century with regard to this matter of internal improvements and expansion of inland trade, the three projects that especially concerned the people of Maryland were the Cumberland Road, the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, and the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad.⁷

The Cumberland Road westward to Ohio was so named because Cumberland was designated as the starting point for the work done by the Federal Government to link the East with the newly settled lands west of the Ohio River. The road became known also as the "Union pike" and the "National road." From the Maryland standpoint it connected directly with the road from Baltimore running through Ellicott's Mills, Frederick, and Hagerstown.

Federal support of the Cumberland road project was an important factor in holding the independent spirit of the Western country in touch with the Union. Jefferson recognized the vital interest of Maryland in connecting the national road with the roads begun by Charles Carroll and the Ellicott brothers when he appointed Thomas Moore and Eli Williams as two of the first three Cumberland Road commissioners, the third being Joseph Kerr of Ohio.

Out of the bank troubles of the early thirties came a proposal by the State that the price of charter extension would be a turnpike toll road to Cumberland. This was accepted by the banks and until the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad crossed the mountains in 1852, the Cumberland highway was the regular route for the picturesque caravans of Conestoga wagons that traveled westward through Maryland, Virginia, and Pennsylvania.⁸

After realizing that the extension of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal from the Potomac, north of Georgetown to Baltimore was not feasible, the people of Maryland decided to construct a railroad. The Baltimore and Ohio Railroad is important not only for the commerce of Maryland but for the development of the whole United States. "The Baltimore and Ohio Railroad was the first successful railroad in America and the pioneer in creating that network of rails which eventually stretched through many states until they reached from coast to coast in their passage through thousands of miles of territory yet to be acquired."⁹

For the next few years long-standing Whig and Democratic quarrels were subordinated by the emergence of two new problems which absorbed the attention of the people. Briefly, these issues were the rise of the American Know-nothing party, and the lawlessness and rioting which was seriously threatening the growth and prosperity of the great commercial center of the state. They played an important part in Maryland affairs. Andrews in his History of Maryland, states that historians begin their references to the American Know-nothing party by way of recording its first notable victory in the election of its candidate for Mayor of Philadelphia. This was in 1854, but the beginnings of an "American Republican" or "Native American" party were announced in the Baltimore Clipper on the 5th of November 1844. A state convention was held on March 5, 1854, which issued an address "To the Public" in which it was declared that the party was pledged to the prevention of frauds at elections, the corrections of other abuses, and to the removal of alien influences, with the restoration of American ideals and ideas. The origin of the party was fundamentally a movement of protest against political conditions in the great centers of population. First of all, much of the disorder and

turbulence of election campaigns was properly attributed to the saloons and the badly regulated drinking of hard liquors. In 1851 Maine passed a liquor law, which caused widespread discussion throughout the Republic. This early prohibition enactment had its echo in Baltimore, when the "friends of the Maine Liquor Law" elected ten delegates to the General Assembly on a platform that denounced the manufacture, sale, and consumption of intoxicating liquors. The delegates were pledged to urge prohibitory legislation.

In the cities the element that appeared most involved in the practices of the saloons and in the "harding" of voters was foreign-born and largely Roman Catholic; hence the cleavage began to assume sharp racial and religious aspects. Again, because of early successes of this reform movement, encouraged as it was by the help of the better class of citizens regardless of birthplace or of creed, the self-seeking demagogue saw an excellent opportunity for political promotion by falling in with the reformers. In respect to election frauds, the indictment brought forward by the American party was sound enough; no one could successfully deny the evils complained of; but, as it turned out, the ills this party set out to remedy were excelled, in Baltimore, at least, by the subsequent practices of unscrupulous leaders who gained control of the new party. The framers of the Federal Constitution had striven to avoid religious dissensions on political lines, but their labors had been in vain; and the far-sighted Jefferson, so early as 1820, forecast disaster when he saw clouds of sectarian and sectional division appear upon the horizon. The Federalists had, in New England particularly, so inflamed the churches against the Jeffersonians that many good people thought the triumph of Democratic party would mean the proscription of the church.

In 1854 the American party elected Samuel Hinks Mayor of Baltimore.
 By 1855 the Know-nothings were sweeping the state. ¹⁰ The American party had become a secret society and was recognized as such. Lodges had been instituted in most or all of the States, with passwords, grips, and degrees. When the members of the party were asked concerning their principles or objects, the answer was "I know nothing." The abolition of "papal supremacy" was a prime motive with many; but the political minded leaders of the movement seized upon any so called "religious" or "moral" issue that could be turned into votes, and among these was the abolition of slavery.

This leads to the consideration of the increase and culmination of another menace which was occupying the minds of thoughtful citizens to the exclusion of other matters, namely, mob rule in Baltimore. Conditions had been bad under various regimes and at various periods; but under Know-nothing rule they reached the climax of disregard for order and decency. ¹¹ With the fall of 1857, the political elements of Baltimore were again stirred for the election contests of the season. "In the meantime the civil condition of the city had become more sensibly demoralized. The press without distinction of party, was filled with everyday's report of wrong, outrage violent encounters of partisans, desperate assaults and homicides." ¹²

On October 19, the day of municipal election, Baltimore was again the theatre of the general prolonged and desperate rioting. Although the bloody scenes "of the preceding year were not re-enacted, yet the election was a mere mockery of the elective franchise accompanied throughout the city by riot and bloodshed.

Exclusion of slavery, public debt, and constitutional reform were problems with which the state of Maryland was concerned. Upon the assembling of the legislature, Governor Philip Francis Thomas, on the 3rd day of January, 1848, laid down before that body a message of great force and power regarding the question of constitutional reform and retrenchment. He was very much in favor of paying off the State debts, and was intent on making the revenue and tax laws effective. He favored the call for a convention for the purpose of revising the Constitution.

The people of Maryland had for more than thirty years been unsuccessfully petitioning the legislature to revise the Constitution. The Lower House repeatedly passed bills requesting the call for a convention for that purpose, but they were rejected by the Senate. As a result of this a "Reform Party" was organized, which pledged itself not to support any candidate for either branch of the legislature who would not pledge himself to support the cause for the revision of the legislature.

The Reform Party wielded a great deal of influence, and assembled in convention in Baltimore to make public declaration of its goals in a set of strong resolutions. In the fall elections of 1849, in a number of counties the Whigs and Democrats united in running "Reform" tickets for members of the legislature, without reference to political distinctions, and in Baltimore City, the candidates of both parties were pledged to the measure of "Constitutional Reform".

When the Legislature convened in December 31, 1849, Governor Philip Francis Thomas gave a satisfactory report on the financial and general affairs of the State. The impoverished condition in which Maryland had been a few years before had completely changed. Maryland was now restored to the honorable position which she had previously held. The governor

pointed out that if the present system of taxation were rigidly adhered to, within thirteen years the State could pay off her entire debt including interest. The resolutions made by the Southern states on the exclusion of slavery from the new territories were considered by the governor.

The most important item in the Governor's message, however, was the subject of "Conventional Reform", in which he stressed that the wishes of the people be satisfied. As a result of his statement a committee was appointed to call for a convention to revise the present, or form a new Constitution which would be submitted to the people at the next gubernatorial election for their adoption or rejection.

In accordance with the provisions of the bill the election was held throughout the State on May 8, to determine the attitude of the people toward calling a Constitutional Convention. The results indicated that the Reform Bill carried by over five thousand majority; Charles and Prince George's were the only counties that voted against it. In the gubernatorial race Enoch Louis Lowe, the democratic candidate received a majority in Baltimore City of two thousand seven hundred and fifty-nine votes, and in the state, one thousand four hundred and ninety-seven over Clarke, the Whig candidate.¹⁴

On the 4th of November 1850 the constitutional convention met at Annapolis, and after a session of over six months, adopted a new constitution. It was long a matter of debate whether the people would adopt it or would insist upon another convention and a rewriting of the instrument; but the constitution was accepted and became operative during the administration of Enoch Louis Lowe, Democrat, elected in 1850. Some of the more outstanding provisions were: the State was divided into three

districts; St. Mary's, Charles, Calvert, Prince George's, the City of Baltimore; the eight Eastern Shore counties; Baltimore, Harford, Frederick, Washington, Allegany, and Carroll counties. The term of governor and of senators was made four years, and it was provided that the judges and many other officers should be elected by the people. Imprisonment for debt was abolished. These reform movements were an indication of the fact that the control of the government was to be more directly placed in the hands of the people.

Restoration of Roman Catholics to political right and privileges brought about special activities among those of that faith in the building of churches and the establishment of schools and colleges. This growth is inseparably connected with life and work of Archbishop John Carroll. Although Georgetown College, which Archbishop Carroll planned, was taken out of Maryland when the District of Columbia was created, this noted university was at least begun on Maryland soil. As the center of Catholicism in the United States, Baltimore was the scene of three Plenary Councils of 1852, 1866 and 1884, as well as of a layman's congress in 1889.

It was in the midst of the slavery issue, mob rule, constitutional reforms, and internal improvements that the press of Maryland produced the imprints which follow.

OUTSTANDING PRINTERS AND PUBLISHERS

Engraved illustrations were popular in the early and middle 1800's.

The check list itself stands as a testimony of the active work engaged in by the printers of Maryland during these two years, 1853 and 1854. In its typographic dress, the printing of this period fell under the influence of the then prevalent Victorian style. Unrelated "fancy" type faces and ornamental gadgets were used in profusion.

The dearth of illustration is due to the fact that only hand-engraved woodcuts were then available and they were quite expensive.¹

Among the prominent printers and publishers of this time was John Murphy, who stands as one of the most prolific printers and publishers. Born in Omagh, Tyrone, Ireland, he was brought to America by his parents who settled in New Castle, Delaware, in 1822. At the age of sixteen he went to Philadelphia to learn the art of printing. After becoming an accomplished printer, he decided to move to Baltimore and establish a printing and stationery house where there was less competition. It was in Baltimore that the firm of Murphy & Co. gained the reputation of being a fine publishing house. Although his interests were mainly in Catholic books, Murphy put out a diversity of titles. He can be cited as a great supporter of Catholic authors, as he was always willing to accept their manuscripts that had been refused by the secular publishing houses. It was through his publication of Catholic translations that the works of foreign Catholic writers were made available to America.²

Located at No. 182 Baltimore Street, the firm of John Murphy occupied a five-story building. On the main floor of this elegant marble structure was carried on the sales and business transactions. It was here that one could find the books of their own publication as well as those of other publishers. Also on this floor were located the historical, scientific, theological, miscellaneous and juvenile books, classical and school books, fiction and all phases of literature. One of their well known specialties was the variety of French works imported from France. The second floor was devoted to the display of foreign publications; the third was a store room for various kinds of paper used in the printing department. This floor was considered the hub of the entire establishment. Their types and presses were known for their precision and excellence of performance. On the floor immediately above was the bindery. Murphy boasted of having for the first time exemplified the practical advantage of combining the printing, ruling, and bindery in one establishment.³

The diversity and versatility of this outstanding publishing firm can be seen by listing a few titles which it produced: The Metropolitan, A Monthly Magazine (1853-59), a monthly devoted to religion, education, literature, and general information; the Metropolitan Catholic Almanac and Laity's Directory; the Catholic Youth's Magazine (1857-61); theological writings of the Kenricks and the Spaldings; Peter Fredet's popular histories, Cardinal Gibbons' Faith of Our Fathers, which proved a best seller; and numerous works of lesser clergymen.

The foreign books brought out by Murphy included Butler's Lives of the Saints, Faber's writings, Thomas Moore's Travels of an Irish Gentleman in Search of Religion, Rituale Romanum Pauli V, John Lingards' Abridgment of

the History of England, J. M. V. Audin's Life of Luther, Cardinal Wiseman's works, Hendrik Conscience's Belgian novels, Chatcaubriand's Genius of Christianity, and Balmes's Protestantism and Catholicity Compared.⁴

In 1855 for the publication of the Definition of the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception, Murphy was awarded a papal medal of merit, and in 1866, for his Acts and Decrees of the Second Plenary Council of Baltimore, he was honored with the title of "typographer to the Apostolic See".

Among his secular publications were James McSherry's History of Maryland, the New Constitution of Maryland of 1851 and also those of 1864 and 1867, and The Maryland Code, Public General Laws (2 vols. 1860), with later supplements, which won the ecomium of his friend, Chief Justice Taney.

John Murphy was a man of integrity and it has been justly indicated that he elevated the publishing business by his ethical standards and high ideals.

John B. Piet entered the printing and publishing house of John Murphy and in 1850 he was admitted as a partner in the firm. He remained in this firm until June 1853, when he gave up business until the following year, and, with M. J. Kelly, who had also been a partner in the establishment of John Murphy & Co., formed a co-partnership with P. J. Hedian and commenced business at 174 West Baltimore Street, under the firm name of Kelly, Hedian & Piet. The house soon established a large and successful trade and after many changes of the firm title, the last being that of Kelly, Piet & Co. On the death of Kelly, in January, 1879, Piet came into possession of the whole business. From the press of this firm came such publications as Kenrick's English Translations of the Bible, in five

octavo volumes. In this field of religion the firm published a number of popular Catholic and theological devotional works including prayer books of all sizes and styles. "The Catholic Mirror, the official organ of the Archbishop of Baltimore and his suffragans, has become deservedly popular under the able guidance of John B. Piet, and has long been regarded as the leading Catholic newspaper in the U. S."⁵

With regard to school books the firm also made a substantial contribution. They published a series of spellers for the public schools of Baltimore which were edited by Messrs. Newell and Creary; a series of mathematical works for the Virginia Military Institute at Lexington, Va., Irving's School Catechisms and Brown & Scharf's School History of Maryland.

Mr. Piet's establishment was supplied with first class assortment of type and possessed all essential appliances of a great publication house. The book department was always stocked with a well selected collection of standard works. It did a large importing business with London, Paris and other cities of Europe. John B. Piet did much in the furtherance of the printing and publishing interests of Baltimore.

The John W. Woods Book and Job Printing office had a reputation for its neatness and exactitude and typographical beauty. Located at No. 202 Baltimore Street, between St. Paul and Charles Streets, this establishment contained two floors one of which was the Compositors' room; the one above was used exclusively for presswork. The composing room was adequately supplied with "fine large fonts of Book and Job type, all of the most beautiful and modern styles of letters for Cards, Circulars, and every variety of Job Work, while the workmen employed are printers of the first class."⁶

The superiority of the printing of this firm was exemplified in their work which was done for Philadelphia houses including medical and dental works. Besides books Woods printed likewise newspapers and the popular "Baltimore Directory" which was known for its accuracy and reliability.

Cushings and Bailey was one of the best known book and stationery house at 262 Baltimore Street; it occupied a five storey building. Their main business consisted in the selling of books and stationery of all types.

Joseph Robinson, who was born in Frederick County, came to Baltimore and went into the printing business. Along with his printing activities Robinson was also the owner of a circulating library in Baltimore. In 1857, he began publishing a weekly called The Monitor, which was edited by Hugh Davey Evans. He was a captain in one of the Baltimore Regiments and after taking part in the Battle of North Point was commissioned a Brigadier General of Militia.⁷

The type and stereotype foundry having a wide reputation through the South and West was that of Lucas Brothers. They furnished printers with every article necessary for a complete printing office. This establishment, which was provided with the most approved and valuable machinery for the production of type, was located on Bank Lane, adjoining Barnum's City Hotel.

It was divided into the following departments:

1. The Machinery Department, where all the Machinery used in the establishment is made,
2. The Casting Department, where the first process is employed. There are 15 Moulding Machines in this Department, of improved condition, each of which is capable of casting 150 type per minute.

3. The Finishing Department. Here the types are rubbed upon mill stones in order to relieve them of their roughness, they are then passed over to the setters, and placed upon sticks a yard long, after which they are passed over to the dresser, who places them in a proper condition for use.
4. The Electrotyping Department, which is provided with a number of Batteries for the Electrotyping process.
5. The Composing Room.
6. The stereotyping or Moulding Department, and
7. the Warerooms, which are constantly filled with every size and description of Type of as beautiful & face and durability as any foundry in the country."

John Gruber began his printing career in Philadelphia and upon the request of Charles Cist, with whom Gruber had served his apprenticeship, he came to Hagerstown and established a German newspaper. Minick states that Gruber was from the first equipped to print in both English and German.⁹ However, no English issue of his press prior to 1801 has survived. Besides his German publications Gruber is best known for his famous almanac. In addition to depicting activities of the farm for every month in the year by means of interesting woodcuts, it likewise contained many interesting items about the weather. This almanac was not restricted wholly to the German language, in 1828 an English edition was begun. As the community grew and the people became more familiar with the English language the German edition of the almanac became smaller until it was discontinued during the first World War.¹⁰

Gruber was known as a man of strong character and during the course of his career he trained many young men in the printing business. Ill health forced him to retire in 1855 from his flourishing business.

The passing years did not deal gently with the printing industry. In the mid-sixties this venerable art began to be mechanized. With the

turn of the century there were rapid changes which produced printing of better grade, in larger quantity, at lower cost, and at a faster speed. To remain competitive it was necessary to keep abreast, in equipment and skills, of the various advances made. This in turn taxed the resourcefulness of the individual. It was an era in which few print shops survived, in the sense that they fully accommodated themselves to this revolution in the industry. Reflecting the severity of the transition which the industry faced is the fact that of the twenty-six print shops listed in the Baltimore City Business Directory of 1853, only two- those started by James Lucas and Charles W. Schneiderith survive today.¹¹
